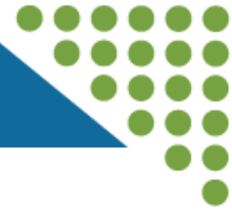

The origin of Central State Hospital dates to the close of the Civil War when the Freedman's Bureau was created to establish hospitals, schools, and other facilities for the freed African American population. The Freedman's Bureau repurposed many existing facilities and Central State grew out of one such facility, Howard's Grove Hospital in Henrico County, a former Confederate facility. The General Assembly then designated a permanent site in Dinwiddie in 1882 as a state mental health facility serving African Americans. When it opened on this site in 1885 373 patients transferred into the new hospital. Subsequently, the inpatient population grew and in the 1960s Central State housed more than 4000 patients. The hospital was fully integrated in 1967.

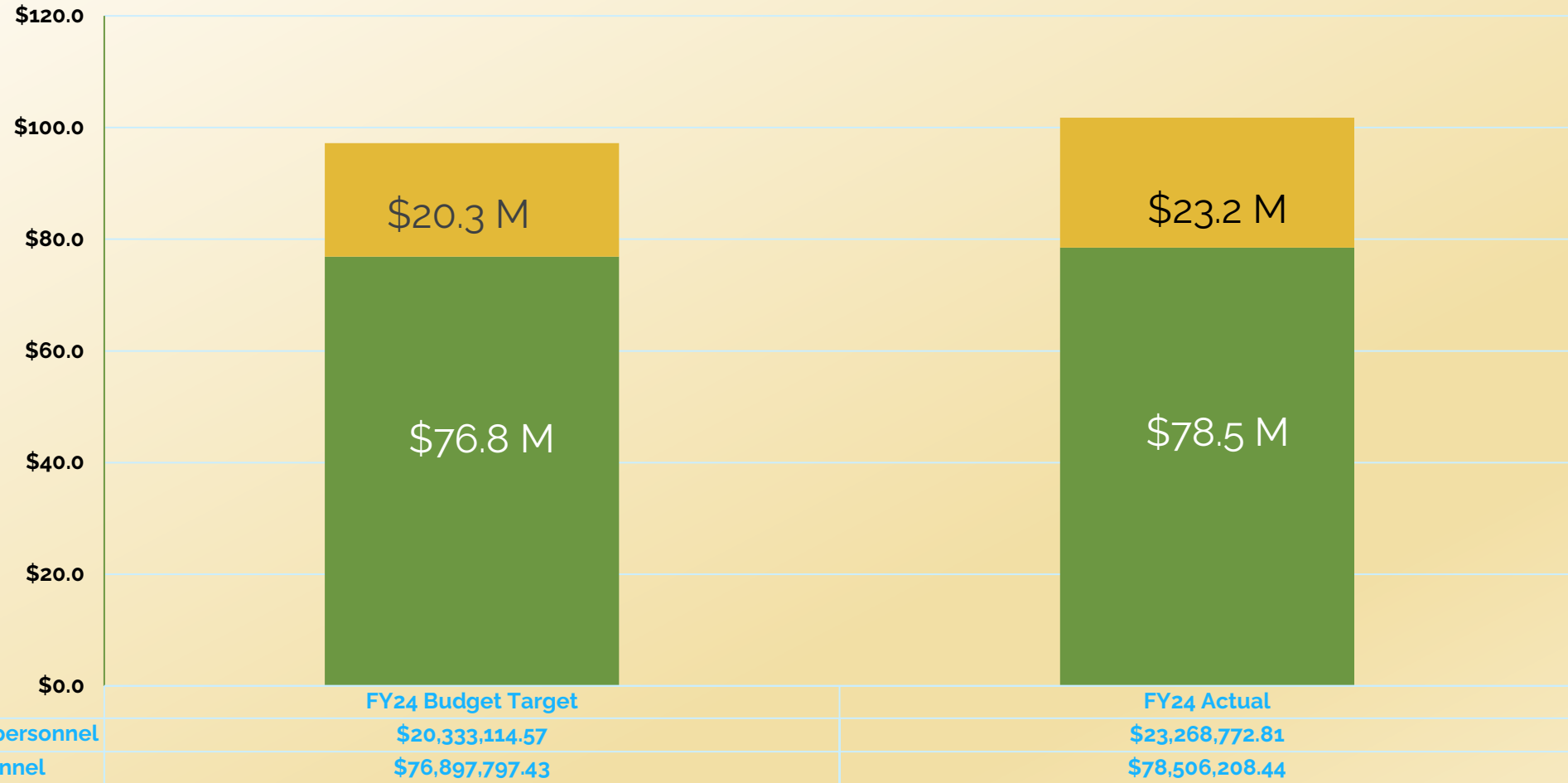

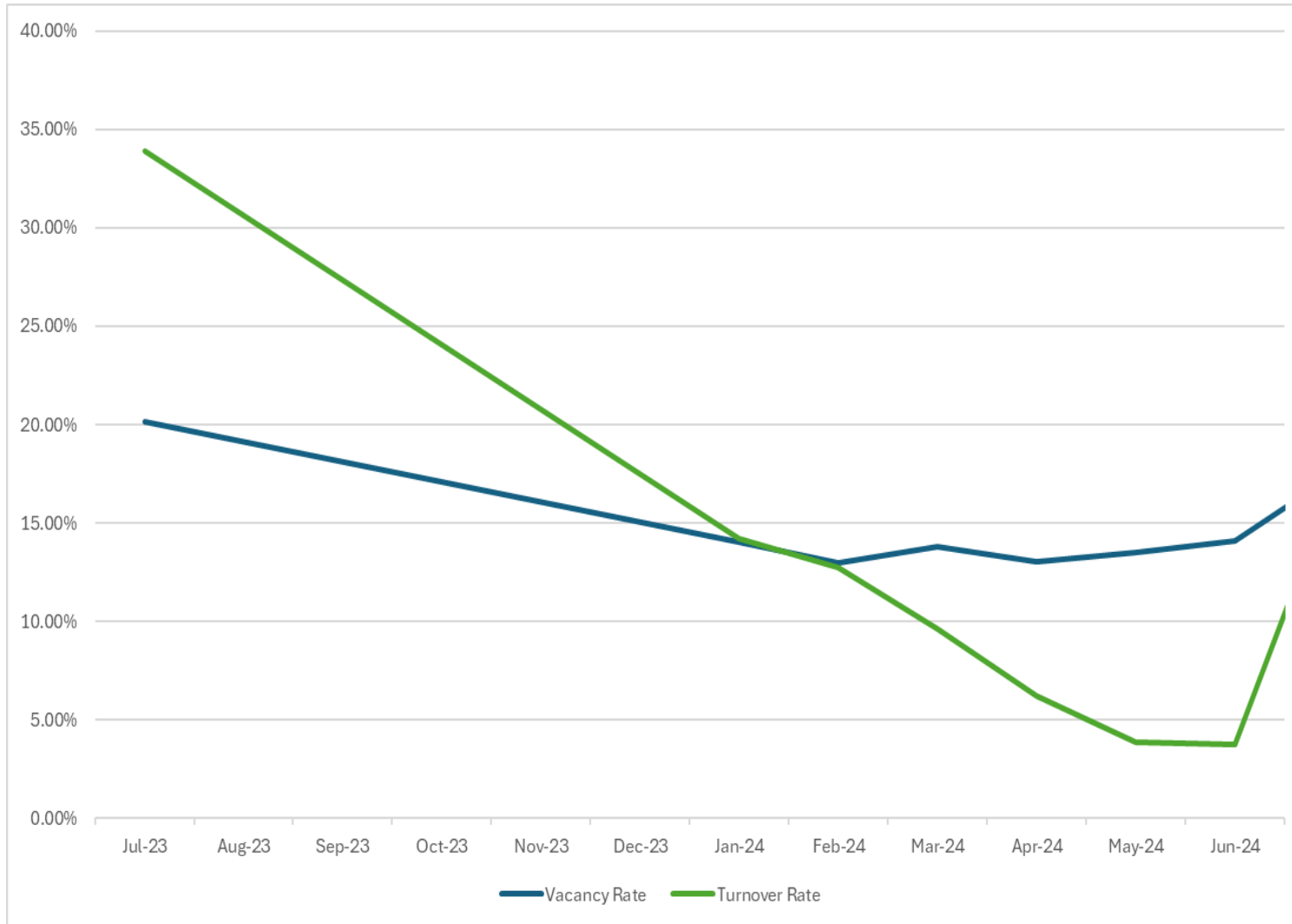

by expense type

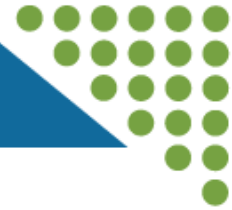

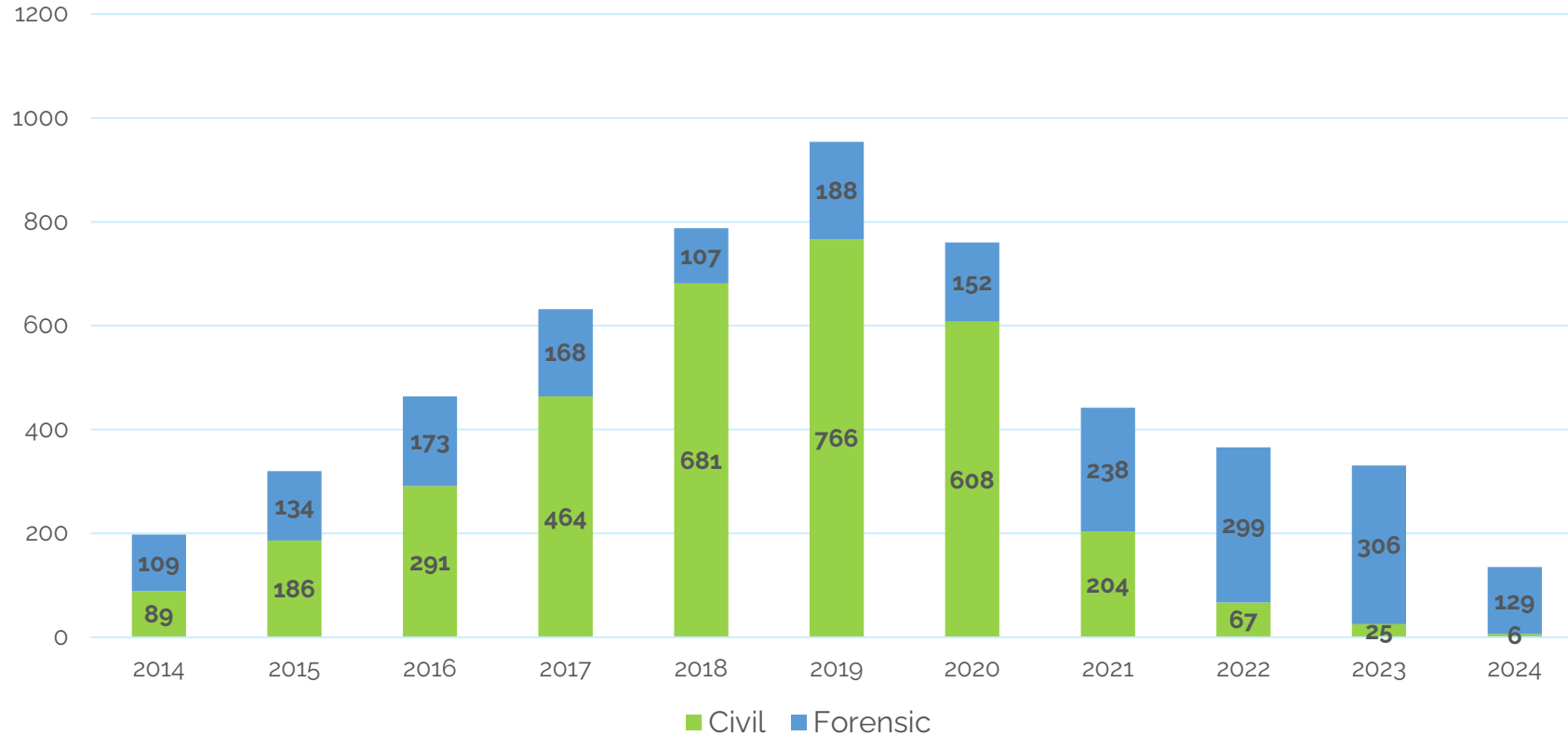

 - Emergency treatment of defendants from jails

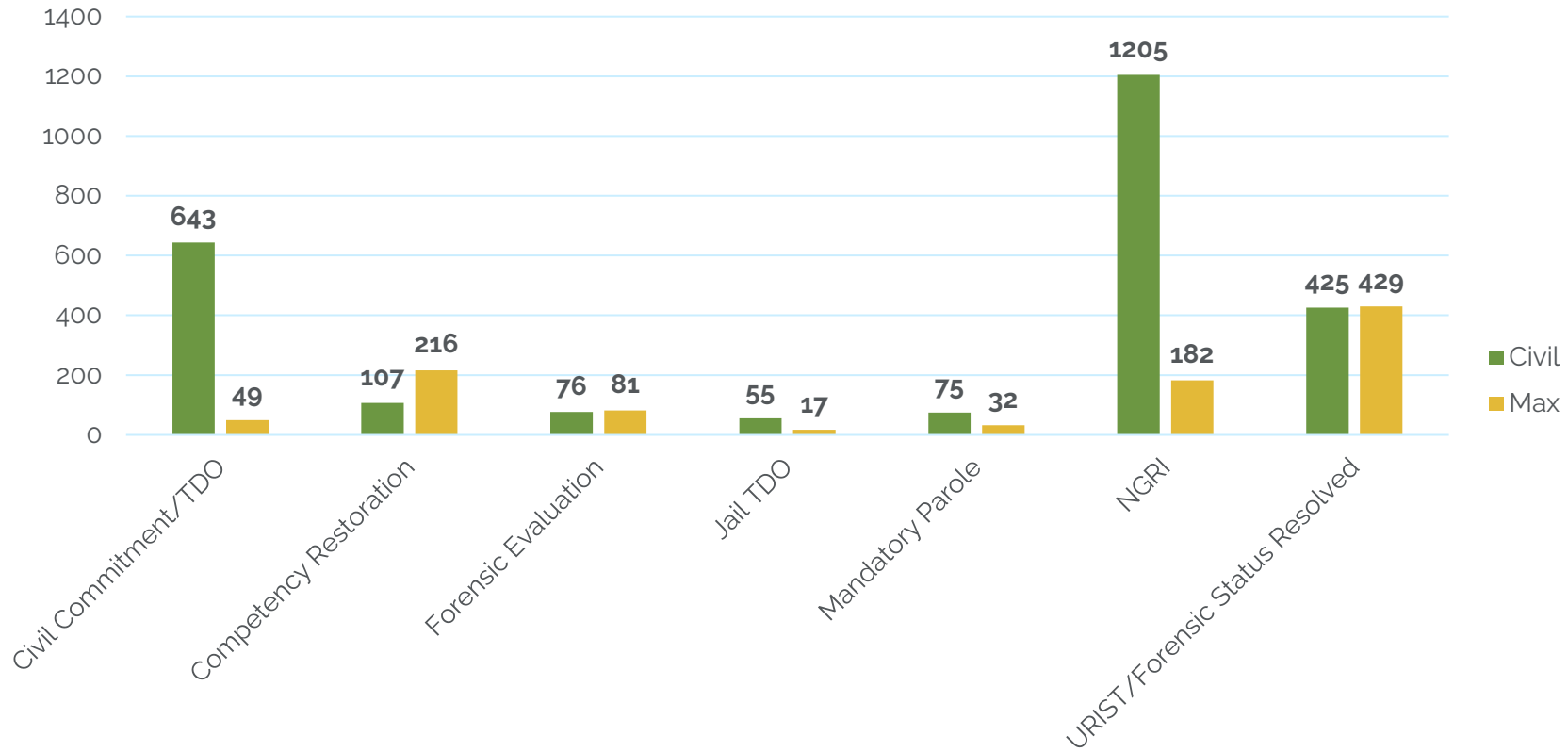
CSH Number of Admissions (Civil Buildings)
