# **Background on BHC** involvement with CCCA


#### BHC directed DBHDS to examine alternative placements to CCCA following operational and performance issues raised in 2023 JLARC study



- JLARC study of state hospitals details concerns with CCCA
  - Recommendation: plan for CCCA closure and use alternative placements
- BHC adopts recommendation directing DBHDS to identify and develop alternative placements for youths who would otherwise go to CCCA
- Appropriation Act officially directs DBHDS to study and develop alternative placements to CCCA by Nov 1, 2024
- DBHDS releases report with findings and recommendations for alternative placements to CCCA
- Health Management Associates (HMA) retained to support the "improvement, development, and planning for a state-of-the-art youth mental health facility"

#### Readmission rates at CCCA were consistently higher than national rates through FY22

## CCCA performed poorly on other key metrics relative to all other state hospitals

Metric	CCCA performance	CCCA performance relative to other 8 state hospitals
Patient-to-patient physical incident rate <sup>1</sup>	73.9 incidents per 1,000 patient bed days	Highest
Patient self-injurious behavior rate <sup>1</sup>	30.2 incidents per 1,000 patient bed days	Highest
Patient restraint rates <sup>1</sup>	17.1 hours per 1,000 patient hours	Highest (40 times the national rate <sup>4</sup> )
% of human rights complaints that were substantiated <sup>1</sup>	32%	Highest
Patient-to-staff physical incident rate <sup>1</sup>	99.2 incidents per 1,000 patient bed days	Highest
Average annual turnover <sup>2</sup>	88%	Highest
Vacancy rate (excl. temporary contractors) <sup>3</sup>	43%	Highest

### Facility deficiencies may have exacerbated staffing and safety challenges

- Poor lines of sight that make it difficult for staff to monitor patient activities and safety
- Areas where staff and patients can become isolated
- Undersized spaces that present a risk to patients and staff if a patient becomes aggressive
- Many weaponizable building features and materials




#### CCCA accreditation was in jeopardy mid-2023

- 28 citations after an unannounced inspection by the Joint Commission, a national accreditation agency, in May 2023
- Determined to be an immediate threat to the health and safety of patients, according to DBHDS

### CCCA costs per admission and per bed day nearly tripled over the past decade

#### Persistent operational and performance issues at CCCA, along with rising costs led to JLARC recommendation to explore closure and alternative placements

- Most other states do not operate a youth psychiatric hospital
- Other states contract with private providers to serve youth who require inpatient mental health treatment
  - Georgia, Louisiana, Tennessee
- Some youth could be more appropriately served in crisis stabilization units or residential treatment centers
- Incremental demand for placements at private hospitals or other facilities would be relatively low due to CCCA's modest size
  - <2 patients admitted to CCCA per day, on average (FY21-FY23)</p>
  - 550+ privately operated inpatient psychiatric beds for youth exist in Virginia

#### JLARC recommendation

The General Assembly may wish to consider directing DBHDS to develop a plan to close CCCA and find or develop alternative effective, safe, and therapeutic placements for children and youth who would otherwise be admitted to CCCA.
